




## What is Passport's Seller of Record (SOR) Program?

The Seller of Record program allows brands to use Passport's UK VAT or EU IOSS number to clear shipments through the United Kingdom (UK) and the European Union (EU). Both of these markets require payment of a value-added tax (VAT) on any imported products, regardless of the value. [In the UK](#), all merchants must register for a VAT ID. [For the EU](#), an IOSS number is required to streamline the customs clearance process and pay VAT to all 27 member states in one place. By utilizing Passport's SOR solution, we'll take care of all aspects of collecting and remitting UK and EU import taxes to the proper authorities.

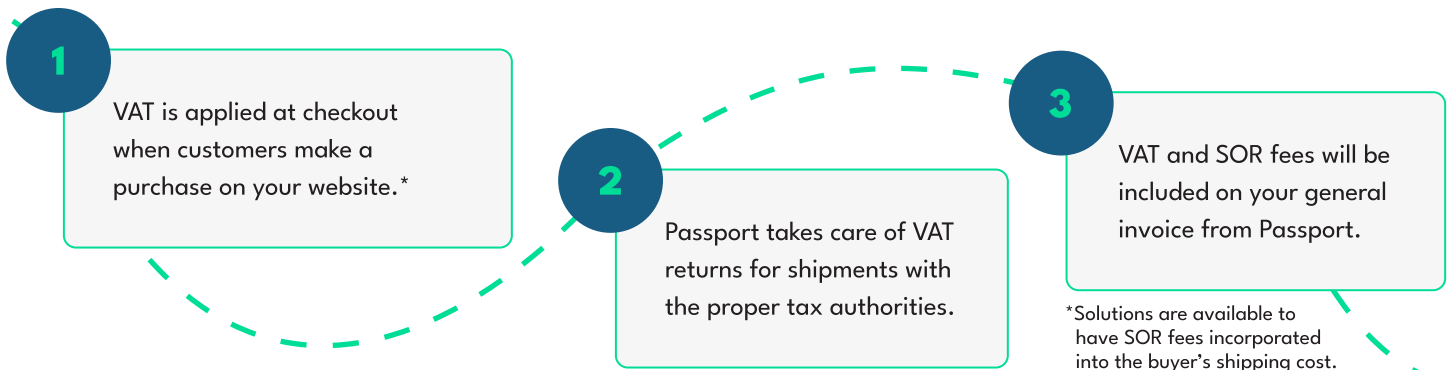
